Pre-Physician Assistant Planning Guide

Course preparation varies by program. This list is a summary of the most common requirements.

| Introductory Microbiology | 101–102 or 303–304 | Yes |
| Anatomy | 328; some programs require 329 lab | Yes |
| Physiology | 335 or 435 | Yes |
| Introductory Statistics | may be taken in major department | Yes |
| Introductory Psychology | Psych 202 | Yes |
| Introductory Biochemistry | Biochem 501 or 507 | Required by some |
| English, Literature or Communications | Many options available on campus | (6) credits required by many schools |
| Medical Terminology | A course off campus | Required by some schools |

Note: Other subjects to consider include Sociology, Nutrition, and Genetics.

* The two semester organic chemistry sequence is not required for PA programs, but is required for some academic majors at UW–Madison.

Step 1: Questions to ask early in your academic career:

- 1. What experience(s) have influenced your interest in physician assistant training?
- 2. What are the skills you associate with a good health care provider? How can you begin developing those skills?
- 3. What are your goals and expectations for a major?

Step 2: Questions to consider in the middle of your academic career:

- 1. How can you gain the patient care hours required by physician assistant programs?
- 2. What are your goals and expectations for a volunteer/work experience in a health care setting?
- 4. When do you want to apply? Would your application be stronger if you work before applying?

Step 3: Things to do the year you plan to apply

- 1. Get letters of recommendation from faculty, research advisors and employers who know you well
- 2. Prepare for and take the GRE
- 3. Write your personal statement and experience statements
- 4. Familiarize yourself with the centralized application (CASPA)
- 5. Do mock interviews
